Fine Motor

A simple fine motor activity for toddlers can be putting objects into an International Delight coffee creamer bottle. It also adds the element of opening and closing. You can use straws, pom poms, Popsicle sticks, etc.

<u>Paint with edible (easy to make)</u> paint!

What's needed:

fresh or frozen fruit food processor or blender food coloring (optional for added coloring) Paper paintbrush (optional)



Soapy Sensory Jars

What's needed:
Plastic jars or bottles, any size
water
dish soap or hand soap
food coloring
glitter (optional)
super glue (optional)



Bird Feeder

Materials

Cardboard Tubes
Peanut Butter
Bird Seed
Knife or Spatula
Plate or Tray
Yarn or Pipe Cleaner
Hole Punch

Start by putting a giant glob of peanut butter on a plate. I gave each kiddo a plate and a plastic knife and a roll. Showed them how to spread it on the roll and let them go.

Then, put some birdseed on a plate and roll the peanut butter covered tube in the birdseed. Sprinkle on the seeds to cover all the PB.

you can now thread yarn or pipe cleaners through the holes punched at the top for the feeder to be hung.



Make Ice Cream in A Bag Recipe in 5 Minutes

Items needed:

1/2 cup milk

1/2 teaspoon vanilla

1 tablespoon sugar

4 cups crushed ice

4 tablespoons salt

2 quart size Zip-loc Baggie

1 gallon size Zip-loc Freezer bag

Mix together the milk, vanilla and sugar in one of the quart size bags. Seal tightly, removing excess air. Place this bag inside the other quart size bag, again removing excess air and sealing well. By double-bagging, you reduce the risk of salt and ice leaking into the ice cream. Put the double bag inside the gallon size bag and fill the bag with the crushed ice. Sprinkle the salt on top. Remove excess air and seal the bag. Shake and the bag, making sure the ice surrounds the cream mixture. Within 5 to 8 minutes you will have Ice Cream! If bags get too cold to hold, wrap with a paper towel. Flavorings can be added to the ice cream to make different flavors. Kids can experiment and make a different flavor every time. This is one of our favorite family activities and everyone gets involved.

Barrel of Fun

Place an empty basket about 20 feet away from another that's full of apples. See how fast the kids can transfer the fruit from basket to another

Handprint Mother's Day Pot Holder

Materials: Pot holder, fabric paint, paint brush, fabric paint pen Instructions:

First make sure the loop on your pot Holder is up. Then begin to paint your child's hands or feet with fabric paint applying a good amount but not too much. Too much paint will cause it to smudge too little and you will have to go back with a paint brush. Allow to dry overnight. With the little space that is left you can put the date, happy Mother's Day, etc.
