Pumpkin Pumpkin

Pumpkin Pumpkin by Jeanne Titherington tells the story of a boy named Jamie and the pumpkin seeds he plants and takes care of. It's a great addition to a preschool pumpkin theme or a lesson about the life cycle of a pumpkin. Your preschoolers will love the story and the activities that go with it. There are many activities you can do that go along with the book Pumpkin Pumpkin.

Sequencing - After reading the story make a chart to show how the pumpkin grew. Ask the children what happens first, next, and so on. Draw a picture to represent each event in the story. Start with a seed, then a small sprout, then a vine and blossoms and continue your chart until the pumpkin is picked and carved into a jack-o-lantern. To assess give each child a paper with the same pictures and have them cut them out, mix them up and glue them in order onto a sheet of construction paper.

Art - Let the student paint their own jack-o-lantern pictures. Let them share their finished paintings with the class.

Balloon Jack o Lanterns Blow up an orange balloon and let the child use a black marker, stickers, or finger paint to create facial features. Ask the child how does the jack o lantern feel?

Roasted Pumpkin Seeds

This is a good activity to do when you are done carving your pumpkin.

Materials

- 1 1/2 cups raw whole pumpkin seed
- Water
- 1 pinch salt
- 2 teaspoons butter, melted

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 300 degrees F (150 degrees C).
2. Toss seeds in a bowl with the melted butter and salt. Spread the seeds in a single layer on a baking sheet and bake for about 45 minutes or until golden brown; stir occasionally.

Pipe Cleaner Spiders

Provide the children with pipe cleaners to make spiders. Have the children twist the pipe cleaners together to form a body and legs. Discuss how many legs a spider has.



Shape Matchup

Materials

- Colored construction paper
- White construction paper
- Pen or marker
- Scissors

Directions

1. Cut basic Halloween shapes (pumpkins, bats ghosts, etc.) out of colored construction paper.
2. Also trace all the shapes onto a piece of white construction paper.
3. Have your child match the colored shapes to those drawn on the white paper

Name Spelling Game

Using letter flash cards, teach your preschool child to spell his name.

Materials

- Index cards
- Pen or marker

Directions

1. Print each letter in your child's name on an index card.
2. Lay them out to spell your child's name.
