Andover Will be closed on Monday, February 15, 2021 in honor of Presidents' Day





Traffic Light Color Match

You will need 2 full pieces of paper ideally one neutral color and one black, some red, green and yellow paper to rip into pieces, some double stick tape or glue, red, yellow and green crayons or markers and something to trace the circles with.

Trace 3 circles on the neutral piece of paper, the top should be red, middle yellow and bottom green.

Hand your child the colored paper to rip into small pieces. This isn't just fun for them, it's great practice for their fine motor skills!

Then start gluing or taping your small pieces in the correct circles.

George Washington Carver GROW A PEANUT IN A BAG

Materials:

Raw peanuts from the health food store

Plastic baggies,

Paper towels

Water

Plant a peanut in a baggie by having each child put one or two raw peanuts in the baggie along with a damp paper towel.

Seal the baggie. Keep paper towel damp-but briefly open every couple days as not to mold.

Observe how peanuts grow.



Valentine's Day Slime

Materials:

1/2 cup school glue 1/2 cup water Valentine Confetti 1/2 cup liquid starch

In a large bowl, combine the glue and the water and mix until well combined. The water and the glue will mix and will make a thin, runny liquid. Add in your confetti. Add a couple of tablespoons of confetti to take your slime from normal slime

to Valentine's Day Slime. After you have the confetti mixed in, add the half cup of liquid starch and mix. You will notice it starts to change consistency immediately! Keep mixing until it's no longer sticky. Switch from mixing with a spatula to mixing with your hands. Press and squeeze the Valentine's Day Slime until it's no longer sticking to your fingers. Store your Valentine's Day Slime in an air-tight container to be able to play with it again and again! If you keep it in a container, it may firm up a bit when stored. If you remove it from its container and squeeze it around for a while, it will get soft and stretchy again. Much like play dough, when cooled, the slime will be a little stiffer and will need to warm up before it's soft again.



The Day it Rained Hearts



Supplies you will need:

- empty cardboard cereal box
- white tissue paper squares
- school glue
- red construction paper
- string
- scissors
- tape

Start by cutting a cloud shape out of an empty cereal box. Put school glue on one section at a time of the cloud and cover it with crumpled white tissue paper squares.

Next tape five strands of string (any type of string or yarn will do) to the back of the cloud.

Then cut hearts out of red construction paper make them varying sizes just as the book described.

Finish by taping hearts to the back of all of the different strings, turn it over to reveal your cloud raining hearts.

WHAT IS BLACK HISTORY MONTH?

Black History Month was established in 1926. Although there is an international aspect to Black History month, it is mainly an American holiday. In 1926, Dr. Carter Godwin Woodson and other African American and white scholars, launched "Negro History Week" so that Americans could reflect on the history and contributions of African Americans.
